



Public Notice of Title VI Program Rights

Reach, Inc., gives public notice of its policy to uphold and assure full compliance with the non-discrimination requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Title VI stipulates that no person in the United States of America shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance. Reach, Inc., ensures that all programs, benefits, and services offered to the public by Reach, Inc., are free from discrimination based upon the protected classes.

Any person who believes they have, individually or as a member of any specific class of persons, been subjected to discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin has the right to file a formal complaint.
